STUDIO ANALYSTS



[Alexi Lalas](#) is FOX Sports' lead studio analyst for soccer, a role he has flourished in since joining the network in 2015. His signature red hair and fierce style of play helped the dynamic defender become one of the most recognizable faces in soccer. Lalas made his mark with the USMNT as a player during FIFA World Cup USA 1994™ and FIFA World Cup France 1998™. He was inducted into the National Soccer Hall of Fame in 2006 and currently hosts ALEXI LALAS' STATE OF THE UNION podcast. Lalas will work his ninth consecutive FIFA World Cup™ as a broadcaster this summer.



[Carli Lloyd](#), a two-time FIFA Player of the Year Award winner and one of the greatest soccer players to ever play the game, joined FOX Sports as an analyst in a feature role less than two years after retiring as a player from the beautiful game. Lloyd made her FOX Sports debut as a studio analyst on the network's soccer coverage in April 2022 before joining FOX Sports in Doha as an analyst for the FIFA World Cup Qatar 2022™. A 2025 inductee into the National Soccer Hall of Fame, Lloyd's legendary international career spanned 17 years and concluded with 316 caps.



[Clarence Seedorf](#) returns to FOX Sports this summer as a studio analyst after first appearing as an analyst with FOX eight years ago at FIFA World Cup Russia 2018™. He made 87 appearances for the Netherlands national team and represented the Dutch at the UEFA European Championships in 1996, as well as UEFA EURO 2000 and 2004 and the FIFA World Cup France 1998™, reaching the Semifinals in all three tournaments. After his playing career Seedorf coached in four continents, becoming Head Coach of AC Milan, Real Club Deportivo de La Coruna and Cameroon national team among others.



[Clint Dempsey](#) returns to FOX Sports after making his analyst debut with the network at FIFA World Cup Qatar 2022™. Dempsey brings a former player perspective to the desk having represented the U.S. at the 2006, 2010 and 2014 FIFA World Cups™, where he became the first and only USMNT player in squad history to score in three different tournaments. He retired from the game in 2018 tied with former teammate Landon Donovan for the title of all-time leading scorer in USMNT history with 57 goals. He was inducted into the National Soccer Hall of Fame in 2022.



[Javier “Chicharito” Hernández](#), the leading goal scorer in Mexico national team history, joins FOX Sports this summer in his broadcaster debut. Chicharito is world renowned amassing 52 goals in 109 appearances over a 10-year run with the national team from 2009 to 2019. He starred for El Tri and is a fan favorite for his accomplishments with the national team representing Mexico in three FIFA World Cup™ tournaments in 2010, 2014 and 2018 scoring goals in all three tournaments.



[John Obi Mikel](#) is a former captain of the Nigeria national team, two-time FIFA World Cup™ veteran with the Super Eagles and a Chelsea FC icon following a decade-long, decorated career with the club. During his time at Chelsea, Mikel won the Premier League twice, the FA Cup four times, the League Cup twice and the UEFA Champions League and Europa League. He also won a bronze medal with Nigeria at the Olympics in 2016. Mikel makes his FOX Sports studio analyst debut this summer currently hosts the fan favorite “The Obi One Podcast.”



[Juan Pablo Ángel](#) was a standout striker across a decade-long career for club and country that featured 9 goals in 33 appearances for the Colombia National Team, and successful runs with Argentine side River Plate from 2007-2011 and Premier League side Aston Villa from 2001-2007. In 2007, he moved to Major League Soccer and joined the New York Red Bulls, where he would go on to post 58 goals and 14 assists in 100 starts with the club. Ángel remains the second leading goal scorer in Red Bulls history and finished his MLS career with 72 goals.



[Landon Donovan](#) returns to FOX Sports as a studio and match analyst for FIFA World Cup 2026™. He made his FIFA World Cup™ debut as a studio and match analyst with FOX Sports in 2022 after first contributing to the network’s Copa América Centenario coverage in 2016. Donovan’s decorated career as an American soccer icon featured three FIFA World Cup™ appearances as a player for the U.S. (2002, 2006, 2010) and countless memorable goals. He retired from the game in 2018 tied with former teammate Clint Dempsey for the title of all-time leading scorer in USMNT history with 57 goals and was inducted into the National Soccer Hall of Fame in 2023.



[Peter Schmeichel](#) rose to prominence as a goalkeeper and left a lasting legacy across a storied career with the Danish National Team and Manchester United in the Premier League. While at Manchester United, he won 15 trophies and helped captain the club to victory in the 1999 UEFA Champions League Final. Schmeichel also played for a Denmark squad that won UEFA EURO 1992™.

Since retiring, Schmeichel has thrived as a broadcaster in the United Kingdom and the U.S.



Thiago Alcântara makes his broadcaster debut with FOX Sports this summer following a dynamic career as a midfielder with the Spain national team and numerous top clubs, including FC Barcelona, Bayern Munich and Liverpool FC. From 2011 to 2021, Alcântara made 46 appearances with the Spain national team and represented La Furia Roja at FIFA World Cup Russia 2018™.

He most recently served as an assistant coach on the staff at FC Barcelona.



[Thierry Henry](#) is one of the greatest goal scorers in France's history with 51 goals in 123 career appearances and set a club record 228 goals with Arsenal in the Premier League. He is the first player to ever win back-to-back European Golden Boots and the first player to ever win Domestic Golden Boots three years in succession.

Henry competed in four FIFA World Cup™ tournaments with France representing the national team in 1998, where he helped France win the tournament in its home country, as well as playing in 2002, 2006 and 2010.



[Zlatan Ibrahimović](#) makes his debut as a broadcaster with FOX Sports this summer following a storied career as an attacking forward that featured countless iconic moments from 1999 to 2023 for several marquee European clubs, including AC Milan, FC Barcelona, Inter Milan, Juventus, Manchester United, Paris Saint-Germain and more. With 114 caps representing the Swedish national team, Ibrahimović is the country's all-time leading goal scorer with 62 goals, playing in two FIFA World Cup™ tournaments in 2002 and 2006 and four UEFA European Championships. He was awarded Swedish player of the year a record 12 times.

FIFA WORLD CUP NOW



[Alex Scott MBE](#) is a former Arsenal captain and England international who earned 140 caps - the second-most in England women's team history - and represented Great Britain at the 2012 Summer Olympics. Since retiring in 2018, Scott has become one of the most prominent figures in football broadcasting. She made history as the first female pundit on Sky Sports' Super Sunday and the first woman to commentate on a men's FIFA World Cup™ match for the BBC and has served as a long-running anchor on BBC's Match of the Day and Football Focus. She was inducted into the English Football Hall of Fame in 2019.



[Bob Bradley](#) is one of the most accomplished coaches in American soccer history, bringing a wealth of tactical expertise and global experience to the coverage. The Princeton graduate served as head coach of the USMNT from 2006 to 2011, winning the 2007 CONCACAF Gold Cup, reaching the final of the 2009 FIFA Confederations Cup - where the U.S. defeated No. 1-ranked Spain - and guiding the team to the Round of 16 at FIFA World Cup South Africa 2010™. A three-time MLS Coach of the Year, Bradley also managed internationally with Egypt, Norway's Stabæk, French club Le Havre and Swansea City, becoming the first American to manage a Premier League club, before returning to MLS as the founding head coach of LAFC.



[Brad Guzan](#) retired in 2025 following a 21-year career as one of the most capped goalkeepers in USMNT history, earning 64 appearances for his country across the 2008 Summer Olympics, two FIFA World Cup™ tournaments and three CONCACAF Gold Cups. His club career included nine seasons in the English Premier League with Aston Villa, Hull City and Middlesbrough, and he won the 2018 MLS Cup with Atlanta United. Guzan has since transitioned into broadcasting, contributing as an analyst for TNT Sports in addition to FOX Sports.



[Jay DeMerit](#) earned 25 caps for the USMNT and started all four matches for the United States at FIFA World Cup South Africa 2010™. The Green Bay, Wisconsin native forged one of the most unlikely careers in American soccer history, working his way from the lower tiers of English football to six seasons at Watford FC - serving as club captain and scoring the opening goal in the 2006 Championship playoff final that earned the club promotion to the Premier League. He later captained Vancouver Whitecaps FC during their inaugural MLS season before retiring in 2014. His journey inspired the feature documentary *Rise and Shine: The Jay DeMerit Story*.



[Kasper Schmeichel](#) is a Danish international goalkeeper who captained his country and earned 120 caps over a distinguished career including the 2018 and 2022 World Cups. He spent 11 years at Leicester City, serving as the club's No. 1 during their historic 2016 Premier League title win and their first-ever FA Cup victory in 2021. Kasper also played at the top level in France, Belgium and in Scotland, winning four trophies with Celtic. Son of legendary goalkeeper and FOX Sports analyst Peter Schmeichel, he has also appeared on CBS Sports' UEFA Champions League coverage, drawing on more than two decades of top-level experience between the posts.



[Kaylyn Kyle](#) earned 101 caps for the Canadian Women's National Team across an international career that included appearances at two FIFA Women's World Cups™ and three Olympic Games. A member of Canada's bronze medal-winning squad at the London 2012 Olympics, Kyle helped secure the country's first Olympic medal in a traditional team summer sport since 1936 and won gold at the 2011 Pan American Games. [Melissa Ortiz](#) is a former professional soccer player and Olympian who has built a prominent career in sports broadcasting since retiring in 2017. [Sacha Kljestan](#) earned 52 caps for the USMNT and represented his country at the 2008 Beijing Olympics across a 17-year professional career. At club level, he won three Belgian Pro League titles with Anderlecht and ranks among MLS's all-time leaders in regular season assists with 99 across 13 seasons, earning MLS Best XI status in 2008 and 2016. Kljestan made his broadcasting debut as a digital host and analyst for FOX Sports at FIFA World Cup Qatar 2022™ and currently serves as a studio host and analyst on MLS Season Pass for Apple TV.



[Walker Zimmerman](#) is one of the most decorated defenders of his MLS generation, earning 46 caps for the USMNT and representing the United States at FIFA World Cup Qatar 2022™, where he started all four matches including the goalless draw against England. A two-time MLS Defender of the Year (2020, 2021) and five-time MLS Best XI honoree, Zimmerman spent six seasons anchoring the Nashville SC backline before signing with Toronto FC in 2026. He currently continues his playing career while making his broadcasting debut with FOX Sports at FIFA World Cup 2026™.
